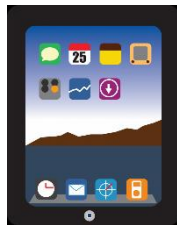


Ms. Ashley's Acceptable Use Policy

Classroom Rules:

1. I will have listening ears; when Ms. Ashley talks I will give her my full attention

Technology Rules:

1. I will ask for permission before using any piece of technology

Internet Rules:

4. I will be nice and polite and use appropriate language
5. If I feel uncomfortable, I will raise my hand to tell Ms. Ashley



Ms. Ashley's Acceptable Use Policy Continued

Plagiarism:

At Springhill Elementary, Plagiarism is a zero- tolerance policy. Plagiarism can include copying someone else's work, taking someone else's ideas and turning it in as your own, or using someone else's work without giving them credit. If a student is caught plagiarizing there will be immediate action taken that could include getting a zero, suspension, or even expulsion.

Consequences:

Breaking rules is a very serious offense in Ms. Ashley's class. If caught breaking a classroom rules, you will first get a warning. After the warning, you will get time out and a note sent home. After the third offense, a parent or guardian will be contacted, and a meeting will be held between myself, the parents/guardians, and the child. The internet rules have more serious offenses. The first offense is loss of technology privilege for two day. After the second offense, a note will be sent home with the parent and the child will lose privileges for a week. After the third offense, the child will not be allowed back on the computer unless I, Ms. Ashley, think they can handle the responsibility.
