1. Kahoot

- a. <https://kahoot.com/>
- b. Kahoot is a place where you can create quizzes or you can also search for premade quizzes that students can take. They type in the kahoot code which is given to the administrator of the quiz and they all take it at once. You can see what percentage of students picked what answer and the students get to create unique ids that allow them to see where they measure up with the class and they can do so anonymously if they wish.
- c. I would use this in my classroom to test my student's knowledge and even let them test theirs before a quiz or a test. It's a fun way for the students to review and for the teacher to assess their understanding.
