- Habitat: Cave



BALD EAGLE

- Listed March 11th 1967
- Delisted July 9th 2007
- Status: Protected
- Habitat: Forested Shorelines




IVORY-BILLED WOODPECKER



- Listed March 11th 1967
- Status: Endangered
- Habitat: Flood Plain Hardwood Forest, Dying or Decaying Trees.

RED COCKADED WOODPECKER

- Listed: October 13th 1970
- Status: Endangered
- Habitat: Mature Shortleaf Pine Trees with
 a specific fungus



LEOPARD DARTER-FISH



- Listed: January 27th 1978
- Status: Threatened with designated critical habitat.
- Habitat: Little River drainage, pools of 10'-40'

AMERICAN BURYING BEETLE

- Listed: July 13th 1989
- Status: Endangered
- Habitat: Open Woodlands and Grasslands



CURTIS PEARLY MUSSEL

- Listed: June 14th 1976
- Status: Endangered, Considered Extinct
- Habitat: Large Creeks, Medium Rivers with good water quality. Buries itself in sand or gravel.



BENTON COUNTY CAVE CRAYFISH

- Listed: April 27th 1993
- Status: Endangered
- Habitat: Clean Cave Springs, found only in the four caves of Benton County



GEOCARPON-PLANT



- Listed: June 16th 1987
- Status: Threatened
- Habitat: Edges of salty barrens in grasslands called *slicks or slickspots*.

PONDBERRY-PLANT

- Listed: July 31st 1986
- Status: Endangered
- Habitat: Wetlands, Bottomland Hardwood, Prolonged Flooded areas.
