


What is a founding document?

A founding document is a written way to establish an organization. The founding documents we are focused on are what established the United States of America as a country and government!




The Declaration of Independence




What does the Constitution do?

The United States Constitution was a founding document that was made to establish how our government works. The United States Constitution set up the different branches of the government and different laws that the new country would have to follow!




Balance of Power?
