Khan Academy Kids was developed by Khan Academy. It is on version 3.3.1. The app is available on Apple products with iOS 9.3 or later, and it can be downloaded on Google Android. It is intended for kids ages 2-7, which is fitting. I'm not sure the entire app could be incorporated into the curriculum, but it would be useful to use the library feature for extra practice. It would also be helpful as an at-home tool. I see Khan Academy Kids app as a tutorial. It is more of helping students master skills based on their grade level.

After downloading the app, create an account and then verify through email. You can choose to do kids mode (kids account only), teacher mode (add in all your students), or a parent mode (add in all of your children). I chose the teacher mode. I had to put in the grade I was teaching and enter the names of the students in my "class". After it is initially created, you can go in and change each child's grade level accordingly. Some students may need to be higher or lower than the actual grade you are teaching. You then click each student and have them begin their work.

The software is a good tool if you want children to just learn random skills. It's not organized in any certain order of how it is presented. It is randomized for each student. You can't really pinpoint what you want each child to work on. I find this app is also more beneficial in the home. It can be used to either kickstart their learning or help them catch up to speed as what is going on in class. The screens are super colorful, and the characters are very cute. The instructions are read aloud and easy to follow. I like how the app has a library with recommended readings for each specific child.
