

Lesson Plan Idea Format

Grade Level & Subject Area: Grade 6, English

Standards/Framework (State Standards, Content Standards, InTASC Standards)

RL.6.3: Describe how a story's or drama's plot unfolds in a series of events as well as how the characters respond or change as the plot moves toward a resolution.

The class will start to read, *A Wrinkle in Time* by Madeleine L'Engle in class. Some sections of reading will be done outside of class; other sections will be read aloud in class. Over the period of time in reading, we will start a graphic organizer. There will be 4 parts. Beginning, Rising Action, climax and resolution; along with a section for each main character to track progress of the character. Each the class will go over how the main character's progression and the different parts of a storyline.

Time (is this a 1 day 50 minute lesson, 5 day 1 hour lesson, once a week over a month lesson....):

35 mins of reading and 15 mins of discussion

What do the students already know? (This could be the Intro or they have learned information before starting this lesson):

They know what characters are and that they have certain characteristics to each of them.

Objective (What are the students' going to accomplish):

They are going to learn about character development throughout an entire reading, while organizing their thoughts for future readings and assignments. Along with the basic classifications of a story line.

The book (*A Wrinkle in Time*), a print out of the graphic organizer, and a pencil.
