The set-up of the app is also really nice, you are clicking on different parts of a map, and the different shapes that you click on represent different puzzles or games that you are going to have to complete. There is no penalty for putting the puzzle piece in the wrong spot, it just disappears and reappears at the end of the lineup, which I really like because it doesn't discourage students from trying to figure it and and discover more about whatever it is that they are working on.</p>
