- Personal VPOD
 - I used YouTube for my personal VPOD. YouTube was my least favorite from the bunch. I had issues with the video and I could not trim the video like I could on clips so I had to restart a few times, I wish they had a trim feature so I could edit my video instead of just restarting it. It's not the worst way to create a video but I believe YouTube is better suited for videos that are already finished and ready to upload, its not great for creating a new video and uploading it.

 - I the IOS app Clips to create the Clips portion of this assignment. I chose Clips since this part of the assignment is me showing my students how to complete a worksheet! mistakes like I was with YouTube. I just wish you could crop out the first bit but that is about it, other than that it was perfect!

More ways Videos can be used in a classroom!

1. Videos can be used to help reinforce learned materials. An example would be a science teacher pulling up a Bill Nye video on YouTube after we went over the content. Bill Nye wouldn't be teaching us new content and he would be going over the same things the teacher did but it sticks more when you learn it again from an engaging and fun video like Bill Nye created!
2. Videos can be a great way to show students how you want a project, homework or anything done. Videos make fantastic and easy to process tutorials! I could make a video tutorial on a homework project and place it on my website and send it to parents to add extra context on certain aspects of the projects.
3. You could make brief videos covering content that was covered in class everyday and upload the file to your website or email it to the parents of absent students! This will help insure no student is left out and everyone has a chance to catch up on content that was learned on days they may have to miss.
4. Another way I could use videos in my class is something I would call video for home projects. For this I would have my kindergarten class learn the ABC song for example among other songs that cover learning material. We can start out by singing the song in class and learning it, after a few days the class will sing the song with a karaoke version playing in the background and I will record. I will place this recording on my website and send it to parents to show parents the new educational song they learned!
