

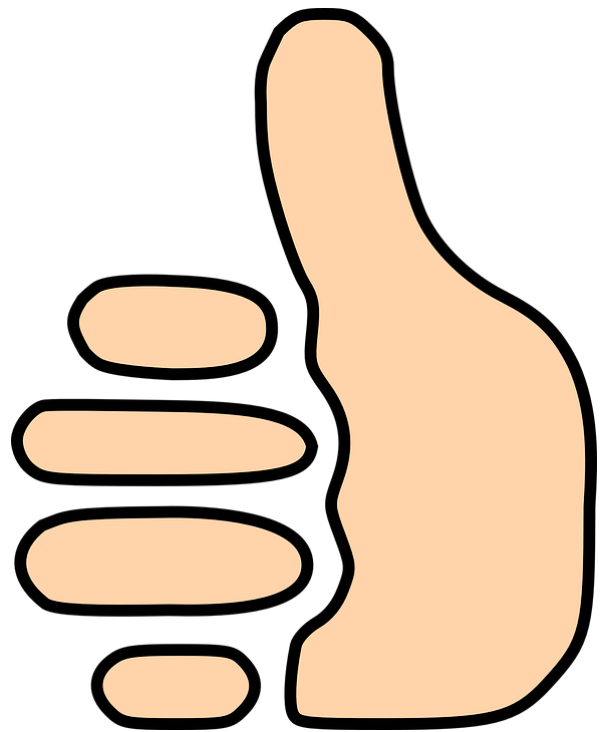
How to Compare and Contrast
