This app had the capability of being set up for up to four children with their own personal accounts to help keep track of their learning development. the appearance of this app was very appealing it was very colorful and easy for children to navigate. This app did not require adult supervision, and the parent/ teacher sections on this app where locked with codes that would require you to be able to read to access them, therefore limiting a child's ability to access those areas.
