Cost: the app is free to download, but does have some in-app purchases, to have full access to this app you would have to pay a monthly charge of \$12.99 to use everything within the app.

Impression/How you would use in classroom: this app is supposed to allow students to digitally document their work, it separates it into subject folders, and allows them to comment on their own or others work if done as a group project. This helps the teacher no longer must drag around binders full of students work to grade and it's all accessible at the tip of his or her fingers. I think this would be great to use in the classroom, it also has parent notifications for when something new is being added it allows them to see class announcements, even newsletters can be sent through the app. This app allows the teacher to find creative ideas and activities to do with their students and allows helps save time on prep in making up new lessons, but in helping you build on an idea to make your lesson better for your students learning needs.
