ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY FOR STUDENTS IN MRS. ERIKA'S 3RD GRADE CLASS

1. Technology may only be used when the instructor allows, and only for academic purposes.
 2. Any student engaged in Cyber bullying activity will be referred to the principle.
 3. Students must observe all copyrights.
 4. Maltreatment of technology will result in loss of privilege of use.
 5. All technology revocation is on a case-by-case basis. The general policy is as follows:
 - 1st access of unapproved websites, files or programs results in loss of tech for 1 day
 - 2nd access of unapproved websites, files or programs results in loss of tech for 2 days
 - 3rd access of unapproved websites, files or programs results in a consultation between parents, teacher, and administration.
 6. Students may not access another student's account. They may not try to guess another student's passwords or information. Students may not discuss any information about their own account (or any other person's account) with other students.
