#### • Target Audience:

App states the target audience is 4+, and we agree to an extent. It would be a good introduction to Educational topics for 4-5-year-olds, but they would not understand the full content until about 9-10-year-old.

## • Type(s) of software with your justification:

The app could be seen as drill and practice and used to review and take quizzes over information already learned. It could also be used as tutorial software since students could go over new information and learn from it. We think it best suits discovery learning software since the student can choose from many different subjects and categories to learn on their own.

### • Curriculum(s):

BrainPOP has categories for the different subjects, including science, social, studies, English, math, art/music, and health. Students could go to the category they are studying and choose a topic within the subject to learn about. They could then write summaries and responses over the videos. Struggling students could use the app for extra practice.

### • Cost:

These in-app purchases are necessary to watch most videos, but you can explore and watch some free movies without it.

The app's home screen has a featured movie, the core subjects at the bottom, and a section for quizzes. Once you go to one of the subjects, there are categories. For example, under science there are categories for cells, nature, chemistry, energy, etc. Under those categories are different lessons in the form of videos. After each lesson, there is the option to take a quiz over the material.

The app covers science, social studies, English, math, arts & music, health, and tech. Once you create a log-in, the app can keep up with the subjects you have gone over and has a place where your scores are kept. Without the subscription, there are 3 free movies per category.

We really like the layout of the software and how easily everything is stored. It comes with a wide variety of subjects and lessons and could be used in all kinds of different classrooms.
