Technology and Device Rules:

- Always use two, clean hands whenever you handle the iPad, headphones, computers, or the Smartboard.
- 2. No food or drinks near the computers, iPads, or Smartboard.
- 3. Only use the apps, programs, and websites that Ms. Springhart tells you you can use.
- 4. When you are finished with an iPad, close out of all programs and apps and then put the iPad on charge in a safe place.
- 5. Never touch the Smartboard without asking Ms. Springhart.
- 6. If something goes wrong with an iPad, computer, or the Smartboard, tell me immediately.
- 7. Always use headphones for sound.
- 8. Be gentle. No horsing around or playing around tech! We need to take care of our tech!

Consequences:

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Internet Rules:

- 1. Never use the Internet to tease, be mean to, talk down to, or hurt the feelings of anyone else.
- 2. If something comes up on our screen that is bad, scary, inappropriate, or seems not right, tell Ms. Springhart immediately.
- 3. Do not give any of your information out on the internet.
- 4. Never give anyone else your password.
- 5. Only get on the Internet (Safari, Internet Explorer, Chrome, etc.) when you've asked first.
- 6. Get off the Internet when Ms. Springhart asks you to.
- Do not download anything or go to any website I haven't given you permission for.

Consequences:

Copyright: Copyright laws protect people's online creations—websites, pictures, videos, songs, words, or anything else—and keep other people from stealing them.

- Fair use: Fair use laws or agreements mean that someone is giving you permission to use something they've made, but you must be careful not to use it in a way that makes it seem like it's yours. That would be dishonest and make the person who created it very upset!
