Amount of Time			
	Introduction:	TTW begin by asking the students if they know anyone who has served as a soldier in any war—a grandfather, father, great-grandfather, uncle, cousin, etc. TSW discuss this. TTW introduce the term "veteran."	
	Instruction:	TTW tell the students that we are coming upon celebrating Veteran's Day, which is a national holiday—including banks and the post office—made to remember those who have served in the U.S. Army in some branch or another. TTW mention that this includes any Veterans in the students' families. TTW then play an instructional video about Veteran's Day to the students. Afterwards, TTW discuss this video with the students and ask what they thought about it and how they think it is important/appropriate to honor veterans who have served our country. Then, TTW send the students to get their iPads and get on BrainPop to find videos and activities surrounding Veteran's Day. TTW instruct students to fill out their Veteran's Day worksheets (which she will pass out) as they go along.	
	<u>Closure:</u>	TTW call the students back together after they have spent some time researching and learning more on their own about Veteran's Day, and they will discuss what they found and recorded on their worksheets.
