- Possible environments and why: A response from students in a math class to show how they solved a problem, a response from students in a reading block to analyze a story, a trailer for a story by students, a how-to video by the teacher for the class
- Cost: Free, no in-app purchases or extras
- Summary: The software is a simplistic, easy-to-use, user-friendly way to take several clips and put them together to make a short video. The user selects multiple photos and video clips from the camera roll, selects length, animation, and even can choose from a wide selection of background music, then puts them in order and makes a video.
- Impressions: This app is a win-win—easy to use, very versatile, very simple. It's not going to help you in a film class per se, but it is definitely a good tool for letting 1st and 2nd graders make videos or show how they do something, OR a good tool for teacher to use when making short instructional videos or slideshows of past work.
