- Target Audience: 4+, but we believe this would probably be best for 6 or 7+. It is slightly advanced technology. Kindergarten may be able to use it, but definitely not younger than that—it can be a bit tedious to add the bubbles and you must be able to type in what you want the bubbles to say.
- Type: Tool
- Curriculum: Any—language arts, math, social studies, science, art, music—anything you could possibly need a mind map or graphic organizer for.
- Possible environments and why: This is a great tool for mapping out ideas, research finds, plans for an essay or website, math factors or multiples, or anything else that can be put into a graphic organizer. This is an excellent tool for all subject areas and can be done as a group, class, or individual.
- Cost: Free, but you only get 3 mind maps and in order to get more, you must pay \$1.99 for each.
- Summary: The software opens up to a clean, white, blank space to work on. Much like Inspiration, you can start adding bubbles to your mind map/organizer. You must go through a process of creating a new bubble each time you want to add, and then they float in whichever direction they choose, until you do a little bit of guiding using your finger. It's more of a slightly directional float than a linear pattern.
- Impressions: We like this app a lot, however, we found the process of adding a new bubble very tedious and annoying. It has unnecessary steps that could be avoided to make the product better. All in all, though, we really enjoy it and believe it could be well used in a variety of ways in the classroom for the reasons mentioned above. It could be used as a means of assessment, a response from students, a whole group activity, an organizational/planning tactic, or even simply a teaching tool.
- Pass/Fail: Pass! This app is well made and could be used in many different ways in the classroom.
