5 min	<u>Introduction:</u>	Explain activity briefly, allow student to get iPads from the charging station and begin working.
	<u>Instruction:</u>	Students will begin creating their iMovie. They will need to search the internet for photos of each phase of the moon, producing three pictures, then arrange them accordingly in an iMovie. This may take multiple days to complete,
	<u>Closure:</u>	Wrap up for the day, have students save work and put iPads back in the charging station. If all videos are completed, have students present videos to the class.

How might I modify instruction for: Remediation? Intervention? IEP/504? LEP/ESL?	ADHD students may need to work with a partner to keep them on task. Remediation students may need help from the teacher on the software.
