1. Edmodo

Edmodo is a tool that looks similar to Facebook. It allows a teacher to easily communicate with her students and other teachers. The teacher is able to post assignments, see student's progress, and send direct messages to students. This tool could be used in making sure students are aware of upcoming assignments.
