- Aquatic Aquatic habitats are all around the world. They are habitats that are completely dominated by water. Aquatic habitats are split up into two main groups: freshwater and saltwater.

- Rainforest The rainforest is very warm and moist with a lot of vegetation. The rainforest is very dense and constantly has heavy rainfall. Chimpanzees, tigers, elephant, monkeys, bats and toucans all live here.
