Explain Everything Collaborate is the title, and we downloaded the 5.2.3 version by publisher Explain Everything sp. Z o.o. The publisher says that it works for ages 4+ but we thought that it would only be applicable for teacher usage. This app would be either a tutorial or drill and practice, depending on how you would like to use it. Since the teacher would be using it as a whiteboard to explain new information, it is a tutorial app. However, the students could use the app as a Drill and Practice to draw lines to the correct answers. It could fit into any curriculum, but would be better for lecture style classes that require a blackboard. This app would really only be appropriate as a teacher tool, but you could potentially use it in a lab setting.

The free trial was only 14 days, but the paid version was \$15.99. If a teacher didn't have a good whiteboard, this is definitely an affordable option, according to Michaela.

The software was simple to use, it even came with a tutorial remarked Carinna. It was a simple whiteboard style with colored "markers" and shape options. You were able to use a stylus or your finger to write on the board. It would be easy to airplay this to a projector in your classroom and move around the room as you write on the board.

It kept crashing and was difficult to get started. However, the organization was clean and clear. Michaela loved the app and would use it in her classroom. Kayla liked it even though she noted "it was similar to paint" but there is a record feature. Carinna liked it because it was easier to use than some similar apps and plain but simple.

Overall, this software passes with flying colors! It was easy to use and a great teacher tool. However, if you are looking for a class-inclusive app, this app would not serve that purpose.
