Rules in the Classroom

- 1. Use polite manners when communicating with everyone.
- 2. Be positive in the classroom. If there is a problem, please come to me and let me help you work it out!
- 3. Be a good listener when I or another classmate is talking to the class.
- 4. Keep your hands to yourself. Do not take other student's belongings without their permission.
- 5. Do your own work. I will gladly answer questions and provide help when you need it.

Rules when using the Computers/iPads

- 1. Computers/iPads can only be used with my permission.
- 2. Keep your hands on your own device.
- 3. Be cautious when getting out and putting up the devices. Use gentle hands.
- 4. Computers/iPads can only be used for school appropriate activities. (schoolwork, learning games, etc.)
- 5. Devices will usually be used for 30-45 minutes at a time. This time frame depends on the activity.

Rules for using the Internet

- 1. Only websites that are school and teacher approved can be used.
- 2. Do not login using someone else's password and username. You many only use your own.
- 3. Downloading anything is not allowed. All of the applications and websites you will need will already be on the device.
- 4. If you are confused or lost on where to go on the internet, ask for my help and I will gladly give it.
- 5. Cyberbullying is never allowed. If you or someone else is being cyberbullied, tell me immediately.



Consequences: If you chose to break the rules above:

- 1. A verbal warning will be given for the first time.
- 2. Parent's will receive a note the second time and device privilages for the day will be removed.
- 3. A call to the parents will be made, you will be sent to the office, and privilages for the week will be removed the third time.

When you copy, cheat or steal someone else's work and use it as your own, it is called plagiarism. There is a zero-tolerance policy for plagiarism inside and out of the classroom.

Copyright is a legal right that gives the owner of the work the right to say how or when their work can be used by others. It is considered stealing to take something that is copyrighted without permission. However, the Fair Use Policy does allow some copyrighted material to be used.
