This could be how well he/she is doing in the classroom or about how their student is acting socially. As a future educator, I will stress to parents the importance of parent-teacher conferences. Since I know that not every parent will attend, and you cannot force them to, I will send out weekly notes to the parents. This may be via email, or a letter in the child's folder. I am wanting to teach elementary students. Younger students change rapidly. Teachers start seeing where the students are lacking and where the students are strong. Parents need to be involved and updated on how their child is doing so that they can give them extra help after school hours to get them where they need to be.
