<u>Type:</u> This app is a mixture of drill and practice and discovery learning. It is drill and practice because most of the information on there is information the students should have already previously learned. It is discovery learning because the students have the ability to pick which activity they would like to do.

<u>Curriculum</u>: This can be used as a brain break in class. The songs are joyful and would get students excited about learning the next subject after viewing the videos.

<u>Cost:</u> Free with no in app purchases but can be become a member to gain more access.

When you first open the app, there is a colorful homepage that asks if you are already a member. If you aren't then you can have 2 activities per group for free. There are Math songs, ABC content, numbers 1-100, geometry and measurement, add and subtract math skills, reading books, etc. The reading will even sound out words that you do not know by clicking on them. There is a place to where you can create your person to look like yourself. There are even Historical American Folk Songs. To keep the students engaged, when a book is being read it makes them press the arrow to go to the next page. This app is great for 2-7 years old.

I liked how the videos were very appealing and the songs were catchy. However, I noticed that on the Telling Time activity, it asks you what time it is and has a timer going off in the background. That can be very annoying and frustrating to students who are trying to focus and concentrate on getting the answer. Then, it you are taking too long to answer the question, a hand pops up and points to the correct answer for you to choose. I do not like that because it does not give the child time to think for themselves. I like how the activities coordinate with what type of season it is. After you complete the activity, they sing a song of time to you. However, it does not show that you have completed that activity.
