## This is the Arkansas State Flag.



Diamonds on a red field represents the only place in North America where diamonds have been discovered. The twenty-five white stars around the diamond mean that Arkansas was the twenty-fifth state to join the Union. The top of four stars in the center represents that Arkansas was a member of the **Confederate States during** the Civil War. The other three stars represent Spain, France and the United States, countries that had earlier ruled the land that includes Arkansas.



Did you know we have a salute to the Arkansas flag too? It is *"I salute the Arkansas Flag with its diamond and stars. We pledge our loyalty to thee"*
