

Plagiarism and Citation

Grade Level = 3

Plagiarism and Citing = Language Arts

Begin the class by watching Flocabulary videos on how to cite sources and plagiarism. Students will pull up the Flocabulary app on their iPads.

After the videos, the class will discuss what exactly is citing and plagiarism. Discuss the importance of citing and why plagiarism is not acceptable. Model examples to students of correct forms of citation. Model a plagiarism as well.

Students will now pull up the Padlet app and create boards pertaining to correction citations. Students use the Purdue Owl website and any additional websites they may come across. Students can create boards with website links. Furthermore, they will find correctly cited materials to add to their Padlet page. The Padlet app will be a form of reference for the students to refer back to when working on research papers. Students will work on this in pairs of two and report to the class their findings. Upon reporting findings, I will have the Padlet app projected on the smartboard and document what the students have found. Students can add items from the other groups that they may not have found and think will be useful. Once gain this is for students to refer back to when needing to cite something and create what they feel will be useful for them.

Wrapping up class, students will be given a pencil and paper short answer plus multiple-choice quiz to see what they have learned about citation and plagiarism.

Technology Tools

Flocabulary is an app that helps to build vocabulary. The app is filled with videos, games, and songs to help master content.

Padlet is an empty canvas for individuals to create their own bulletin style boards. Fill the space with anything you like, from word documents to website links. Create and personalize your space.
