Target Audience: Made for ages 9-11, but it could easily be used by all K-6 students.

Type(s) of Software: <u>Discovery Learning/Tutorial/Drill and Practice-</u>The student determines what they learn by choosing the video, unless the teacher assigns them certain videos. It is a tutorial because information could be educational (not all of it is) and new to them. It could also be drill and practice because some information may be reminders or ways to remember previously learned concepts.

Curriculum(s): I wouldn't necessarily call it educational. I don't think it would fit into any teachers curriculum. That doesn't mean it's useless though. It could be used if the teacher sets aside time for students to have what I like to call "thinking" time, it could also be called rest, or a break.

Cost: \$64.99 per year or \$9.99 a month, after a free trial.
