## • <u>Description of the software:</u>

There is a box that you can make longer with a plus sign attached to it. You double click on the box and you are able to type whatever you want to inside it. If something else connects to what you've typed, you can click the plus sign and easily add links to your mind map.

## • <u>Impressions</u>:

This app was pretty good in terms of mind mapping. It's very simple and compared to total recall, it offers a lot more. It has graphics, stickers, and you are even able to add your own photos from the camera roll.
