- <u>Target Audience</u>: The age rating on the app store say it's for ages 0-5, which we think 0-3 is not accurate. 4-7 does seem like a good age range for this app.
- <u>Type of Software:</u> We would say this app type is probably a Problem Solving type. We think this because you have to hear the word and listen for the word family to figure out how to spell the word.
- <u>Curriculum</u>: This app could be used for students who need help with learning
 how to spell by incorporating word families. It would most likely be used for
 the students who are below grade level because the words are on the easier
 side.
- <u>Cost</u>: This app was free to download, but after completing the first three
 word families, you are required to pay for the app. You can pay \$6.99 for
 limited access or \$14.99 for full access.

• Description of the software:

This app is supposed to help students with learning word families. When you first open the app, there is a long intro screen that introduces the character you see throughout the game. Then that character is on the first circle on a map. When you click on the character, it takes you to the first set of word families. The character says the word and the students have to determine how to spell the word. After spelling all the words, the character moves on to the next spot on the map that features a different word family. After completing three spots on the map, you have to pay for the app.

• Impressions:

This app had pretty good graphics. It was fun and would be fun for younger students who need help with spelling. It would be better if it had different levels for students who need a higher difficulty level. The navigation was really easy and would not be difficult for students to grasp.
