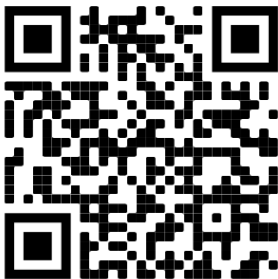


Padlet
