If the parent understands what the child is doing in class, they can be involved and help. Newsletters and constantly updating my website can also help involve parents and inform them about what their child is doing in the classroom. Once a year I can host a school day that allows parents to come to a class period and see the projects and work that their child does and to also see how the class functions. For parents who are unable to make it to the classroom, something could be sent home or uploaded to show any information they missed. These activities will allow for parents to have a chance to get involved with the work that their sixth-grader does daily.
