5. **Do not** upload or encrypt images onto non-approved websites.

Classroom consequences:

1st warning: **verbal reminder**

2nd warning: **behavioral log & recess privilege revoked**

3rd warning: **note to parent**

4th warning: **phone call home to parent**

5th warning: **referral/ office visit**

please note: if your child breaks a technology rule, they will automatically sign the behavioral log, have recess privileges revoked for the day, have a phone call to parent and potentially have an office referral.
