40 min	- Lesson	 First, go over the words of the Pledge of Allegiance a few times; use "Learn the Pledge of Allegiance" website. After going over the words a few times, pass out the fill in the blank worksheet. The children will cut out the words on the left side and glue them over the words on the right side, in the correct spot. Next, use the "History of the Pledge of Allegiance" website and pass out the "Explanation" worksheet. Go over the "History of the Star-Spangled Banner" website with the children and after going over the history, play the YouTube video with the song. Have the children fill out the "Fill-In" worksheet along with it and for the remainder of the lesson the children will color the U.S. Flag worksheet while we continue to listen to the National Anthem.
5 min	Closure: - Reflection	- We will reflect on what we have learned, and the children may ask questions and show off their flags to the class.
