

## Clips How To Story Board

For this video I chose to teach the children something I learned in Art for Teachers. This project can be used as a bookmark for their reading and the children can work on this project when they are done working on the assignment or finished with a test; this will keep them occupied and quiet until it is time to talk again in the classroom.

1<sup>st</sup>: Get supplies – 5 straws, 5 pieces of yarn (arm's length), 1-2 colors of yarn (both arms' length), 2 pieces of tape, scissors

2<sup>nd</sup>: Take 5 straws, one at a time, and slide through a piece of yarn (arm's length) through each

3<sup>rd</sup>: Put straws and yarn together and tie knots at each end

4<sup>th</sup>: Use tape to tape all 5 straws together at each end

5<sup>th</sup>: Take your yarn that is both arms' length and slide it through the first slither of the straws (just under the tape) and tie a knot, so that the yarn does not move when you start weaving

6<sup>th</sup>: Tie a bobby pin to the other end of the yarn (both arms' length)

7<sup>th</sup>: Start weaving! You will slide the bobby pin through the first slither (down) and then come back up through the second slither and so on, so forth for the rest of that row

8<sup>th</sup>: Once you went through the first time, you will wrap back around and come back up through the first slither on that side. You will begin your weaving motion and continue that until you run out of yarn or until you want to stop weaving.

9<sup>th</sup>: Tie knot on to the last straw where the yarn stopped

10<sup>th</sup>: Cut the straws (enough to tie a knot at the end), pull the straws out and tie the yarn at the end so that it does not unravel.

And there you have it! A nice bookmark or gift for a friend or family member!
