Amount of Time	Teaching & Learning Activities	Describe what YOU (teacher) will be doing and/or what STUDENTS will be doing during this part of the lesson.
10	<u>Introduction:</u>	In the beginning, students will sit within their groups and discuss what a symbol means. I will ask them if they know a symbol of the United States. They will then discuss that within their groups.
	<u>Instruction:</u>	After a 5-minute discussion period, the students will direct their attention to the smartboard, where I will display the video from BrainPop. The video will discuss what a symbol is, and how there are national symbols, along with state symbols. This video will focus mainly on national symbols, but will touch on state symbols, which will be learned in the next lesson. After watching the video, I will ask the students if they can think of any symbols. Afterwards, the students will make their way back to their seats. The students will receive 2 coloring sheets. One of the state flag, and one of our national bird, the Bald Eagle. After coloring these sheets, the students will turn them in to me. I will hang these up in the hallway.
	<u>Closure:</u>	After the students finish, and clean up, then they will take a seat back into their pod. We will close with saying the pledge of allegiance.


